U.S. Department of State (2010-03-11):

Announcing a donation of 1.7 million dinars (approximately \$25,400) to Belgrade's four domestic violence shelters, Ljajic stated that 250

children and 150 women had made use of the facilities since the beginning of 2009.

The few official agencies dedicated to coping with family violence had inadequate resources. The NGO community played the primary role in combating violence against women. NGOs operated shelters for female victims of violence, and the government continued to provide financial support to safe houses for victims of family violence throughout the country.

There were separate shelters in operation for domestic and foreign trafficking victims. During the year 40 victims, including 10 minors, were accommodated in two shelters and at the Center for Children without Parental Care.

Landinfo (2009-11-24):

"The Counseling Center Against Family Violence" i Serbia driver et krisesenter for kvinner, hvor driften er delvis statsfinansiert. I november 2007 åpnet myndighetene et nytt mottakssenter i Beograd for kvinner som har blitt utsatt for familievold.

Landinfo skriver att det finns elva kommunala sociala centra som tar hand om trafficking offer. Flera av dem driver också "shelters". De har separata avdelningar för nationella och utländska offer.

Austrian Centre for Country of Origin and Asylum Research and Documentation skriver att under de senaste fem åren har 400 kvinnor fått hjälp av "centrum för socialarbete" (Centar za socijalni rad) i Leskovac. Denna kvinnojour är den första som finansierades inom det sociala statliga säkerhetssystemet. Austrian Centre skriver att det finns 9 kvinnohus som tar

emot kvinnor som flyr våld i hemmet. Två av dem ligger i Belgrad och där ska ett tredje kvinnohus skapas.

I samma sammanställning citeras Open Society Institute från 2006:

Ten shelters exist in Serbia: nine for victims of domestic violence, and one for women victims of trafficking (in addition, one provisional shelter for domestic violence victims was formed in Vojvodina, as a grassroot initiative of self-organized rural women). Shelters are mostly run by women's NGOs; funding for their operation depends predominantly on foreign donations, in the lack of financial support from the state. Several shelters are operated as partnership projects of NGOs and state-run institutions (Centers for Social Work) and may receive project-based grants from the Fund for Social Innovations. In 2006, the total capacity of shelters for domestic violence victims was 117 persons (including women with their children). It could be calculated that there is one shelter place for 38,500 adult women in Serbia (if each woman who needs placement in a shelter has, on average, two children). There are 39 hotlines for victims of violence against women (mostly for victims of domestic violence), 36 of which are run by NGOs and three by Centers for Social Work. There is one more state-run hotline, which operates 24 hours a day, but it is specialized in supporting children only.

Immigration and Refugee Board of Canada (2009-05-01):

Sources report that there were nine shelters for victims of domestic violence in Serbia in 2006 and 2007 (SEESAC 2007, 9; OSI 2006). According to OSI and SEESAC, shelters are mostly run by NGOs and rely on foreign funding (OSI 2006; SEESAC 2007, 9). [...] Some shelters operate in partnership between NGOs and state-run centres for social work (OSI 2006; SEESAC 2007, 10 see also COE n.d., Sec. 2).
